It was 70 years ago on, December 8, 1945, when 21 year-old Earl Scruggs and his guitar-playing pal Lester Flatt joined Bill Monroe and his Blue Grass Boys on the stage of the Grand Ole Opry for the first time. Scruggs' revolutionary style of banjo picking, in concert with Flatt's extraordinary guitar work and Monroe's singular mandolin, set music on a new course that would forever be known as bluegrass music. Or, as Mr. Monroe liked to call it, "My music."

Bluegrass lovers around the world owe these men a great debt for creating this unrivaled sound.

Speak Up for Bluegrass Junction

It was announced that Sirius XM will be changing the musical format of channel 61, Bluegrass Junction, for 9 days. Instead of the 24/7 bluegrass signal so many listeners have come to love, they will broadcast Hanukkah Radio, in honor of the Jewish celebration of lights.

The network chooses from among its nearly 400 channels (80+ music channels via satellite) to pre-empt for seasonal programming each year. Why they chose one so prominent as bluegrass is an open question, and repeated attempts to reach someone this morning in their programming department have been unsuccessful.

The change will occur at midnight on Sunday, December 6, and Bluegrass Junction programming is set to resume on the 15th.

During the interim, subscribers will only be able to access the bluegrass channel online.

This is another sign of the diminished value the company sees in its bluegrass product since Sirius and XM merged in 2008. The two satellite radio players had both experienced difficulty penetrating the market sufficiently to become profitable, and it is widely believed that the merger saved them both.

"Dear Friends, I have learned that Sirius XM Radio is pre-empting our Bluegrass - Channel 61 for eight days.

This brings me great concern, and nothing against any other style of music, but the fact that they would devalue Bluegrass Music enough to think we would not miss it for 8 days. #KeepBluegrassOnSiriusXM

After all, many subscribe just to listen to Bluegrass music. I hope you will call and write to let SIRIUS XM.

Let them know how much we love Bluegrass music, and that we don't want to miss one second of bluegrass music on Sirius XM.

When I called, they gave me a simple, "sorry" it will be back on after the 8 days. I then ask for a manager, who offered a \$10 credit for the loss of Bluegrass.

Then I wrote the email addresses below, voiced my concern, and told them I'd rather not miss a second of Bluegrass music on Sirius XM.

Recipes



Favorite Sugar Cookies Recipe

Ingredients:

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 egg
- 1-1/2 teaspoons almond extract
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt


FROSTING:

- 6 tablespoons butter, softened
- 3 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 to 4 tablespoons 2% milk
- Food coloring of your choice, optional
- Colored sugar, edible glitter, nonpareils or frosting of your choice, optional

Directions:

1. In a large bowl, cream butter and confectioners' sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and extracts. Combine flour and salt; add to creamed mixture and mix well. Chill 1-2 hours.
2. Preheat oven to 375°. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to 1/8-in. thickness. Cut with floured 2-1/2-in. cookie cutters. Place on greased baking sheets. Bake 7-9 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to wire racks to cool.
3. For frosting, in a small bowl, combine butter, sugar, vanilla and enough milk to achieve a spreading consistency. If desired, tint with food coloring. Frost cookies; decorate as desired. Yield: 6-7 dozen.

Frosted Egnog Cookies Recipe



Ingredients:

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup eggnog
- 5-1/2 cups all-purpose flour

- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

ICING:

- 1/4 cup butter, softened
- 3 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1/3 cup eggnog

Directions:

1. In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in eggnog. Combine flour, baking soda and nutmeg; gradually add to creamed mixture and mix well. Shape into four 10-in. rolls; wrap each in plastic wrap. Refrigerate overnight.
2. Preheat oven to 375°. Unwrap and cut into 1/4-in. slices. Place 1 in. apart on

ungreased baking sheets. Bake 8-10 minutes or until set. Remove to wire racks to cool.

- For icing, in a large bowl, beat butter until fluffy. Add confectioners' sugar and eggnog; beat until smooth. Frost cookies. Store in an airtight container. Yield: about 13-1/2 dozen.



Winter Fantasy Cupcakes Recipe



Ingredients:

- 1 to 2 cans vanilla frosting (16 ounces each)
- Cupcakes of your choice

SNOWMEN:

- Coarse sugar
- Chocolate wafers
- Semisweet chocolate chips and miniature semisweet chocolate chips
- Orange candy slices
- Additional vanilla frosting
- Blue food coloring, pearl dragees, blue jumbo diamond sprinkles and edible glitter, optional

Directions:

- Frost cupcakes, reserving some frosting for decorating as desired.
- For snowmen cupcakes: Dip the top of each cupcake in coarse sugar; gently shake off excess sugar. For stovepipe hats, microwave chocolate wafers for a few seconds to slightly soften as needed. Use a serrated knife to cut two narrow strips from opposite sides of each wafer. (Large center piece will form crown of hat; one strip will form the brim.)
- Add chips and mini chips to cupcake to form eyes and mouth. Cut a small piece of orange slice to form the nose.
- Stick brim of hat, rounded side up, into top of cupcake; insert hat crown into the top edge. Secure with additional frosting. Color frosting if desired; place in a resealable plastic bag. Cut a small hole in corner of bag. Pipe a decorative hat band; add dragees and sprinkles if desired. Sprinkle cupcakes with glitter if desired. Yield: varies.


