30th Anniversary PEI Bluegrass & Old Time Music Festival July 3-5, 2015 Performer Preview

The 30th annual Bluegrass & Old Time Music Festival will be held on July 3-5 2015 at the festival grounds up in Rollo Bay, PEI. To help celebrate this year we are happy to welcome the Lonesome River Band, The Clay Hess Band as well as The Spinney Brothers and Ned Crisp and Bottomline to the Island. Below is an overview of some of the artists attending this years' festival.

The Lonesome River Band consists of members, Sammy Shelor (banjo and harmony vocals; Brandon Rickman (lead & harmony vocals and guitar); Mike Hartgrove (fiddle); Barry Reed (bass, harmony vocals); and Randy Jones (lead & harmony vocals, mandolin). Together Lonesome River Band have been one of the most popular and influential acts on the bluegrass festival and concert circuit since the release of their breakout CD, Carrying The Tradition, back in 1991.

The Clay Hess Band consists of members, Irl Hees (Bass, Vocals); Nick Keen (Mandolin, Vocals); Brennan Hess (Rhythm Guitar, Vocals); Zach Gilmer (Banjo, Vocals) and Clay Hess himself who plays



Bluegrass Lead Guitar and Lead Vocals. Clay Hess is a Grammy Award winner who first burst upon the national Bluegrass music scene as the red-hot flat-picking guitarist with Ricky Skaggs & Kentucky Thunder, with whom he toured for three years. With his amazing speed and sense of syncopation, Hess has established himself as one of the top flat-pickers in the bluegrass world.

The Spinney Brothers Allan (Guitar, Vocals) and Rick (Banjo, Vocals) debuted their



band in 1992, sporting a unique duet immediately vocal style that was its' recognized for energetic and distinctive sound. The brothers hail from the Annapolis Valley in Nova Scotia and are joined onstage with Gary Dalrymple (Mandolin) and Terry Poirier (Upright Bass). Together they showcase original material,

and drawing from their musical influences, the Spinney Brothers effortlessly intertwine the past with the present.

Ned Crisp and Bottomline consists of himself playing Banjo; Jared Doss (Mandolin); Bryan Ross (Dobro); Don Rambo (Bass); Tyler Robertson (Acoustic Guitar). From the hills of eastern



Kentucky, Ned Crisp & Bottomline carry on the tradition of bluegrass music and pay homage to its birthplace. This highenergy group offers both contemporary and traditional sounds of bluegrass and bluegrass gospel music. Their style is uniquely fresh and features tight harmonies that complement their lightning fast instrumentation, proving this groups versatility.

On the success of his first album "Country Roots", Dylan is now back in the studio working on a second CD. It is wonderful to know that Bluegrass and Old Time Music will continue with the generation, with next and Dvlan Fergusson, it is in good hands.

Janet McGarry and Serge Bernard have performed for many years at bluegrass festivals and other events throughout Eastern Canada. They showcase unique


harmonies and instrumentals vocals. within their songs. As Janet played her guitar, she paid tribute to bluegrass music and to her musical heroes. Along with the instrumentation wonderful of Serae Bernard, they covered some original songs off of Janet's new cd entitled "Beneath the Painted Sky", which was released in August of 2014. Another big thank you to The Daughter of Bluegrass, who once again shined the spotlight on Bluegrass music.

Many of us were introduced to Notre Dame de Grass, a group all the way from Quebec City. With hard-driving fiddle playing, mandolin picking, banjo rolls and strong vocals, this five piece band specialized in original songs and instrumentals. They put on a fabulous show and this is definitely a group to keep an eye on in the future.

The one and only Spinney Brothers ended the night with a banjo bang. Alan and Rick Spinney are two down to earth brothers who from a young age, shared the bond and love for Bluegrass music as well as sharing the same birthday one year apart. All the way from Annapolis Valley Nova Scotia they brought the sound of traditional and southern flavoured bluegrass music. Even though the band has been together since 1992, it has only been the last five years that the brothers have been able to pursue music as a full time career. It was a true pleasure to see them perform and hear the stories that brought life to their music. They performed original songs such as the emotional "Proud to be your dad" along with the hysterical song "I Want My Dog Back." Just like the name of their new CD. the Spinney Brothers are definitely "Tried and True". Looking forward to seeing them again this year at the 30th Annual Bluearass and Old Time Music Festival in Rollo Bay, PEI.

IN MEMORY OF TUT TAYLOR

The Bluegrass Community lost a very important contributor and lover of Bluegrass music on April 9, 2015. Tut Taylor passed away at the age of 91, and has



left behind a legacy that will continue to influence the next generation of pickers.

Tut is best known for being a pioneer on the dobro. Traditionally a dobro is played using thumb and finger picks. However, like many other musicians have done, Tut taught himself to play music on the dobro by ear. Instead of using thumb and finger picks, Tut used a flat pick, which incidentally became his trademark and signature sound.

He has recorded and performed for decades with many of the greats of Bluegrass and Country Music. He has performed, recorded and influenced bluegrass artists such as Roy Acuff, Bill Monroe, Norman Blake, Clarence White, Porter Wagoner, Vassar Clements and Dobro master Jerry Douglas. You can hear Tut play on many albums including the album "The Great Dobro Sessions" that he co-produced with Jerry Douglas. This won a Grammy for the Best Bluegrass Album of the year in 1994. Jerry Douglas gathered many other famous Dobro players to take Tut Taylors' compositions to create a tribute album entitled "Southern Filibuster". I highly recommend listening to any of these records to any Bluegrass and Country Music Fan.

You will be dearly missed Tut. On behalf of the Bluegrass Community, thank you for everything you have done to contribute to Bluegrass music and to enriching the lives of others.
