28th Annual Festival Report

Newton & Thomas Band



Our 28th annual festival was a success and the planning is well underway for the 29th. The US bands that have been hired to date are Audie Blaylock & Redline, Shannon & Heather Slaughter & County Clare and Art Stevenson & Highwater.

Audie Blaylock & Redline

Audie Blaylock's mellow, wailing tenor and lightningfast guitar picking have made him one of the names to watch in the world of traditional bluegrass. Audie Blaylock took center stage in 2010 with his selfproduced album, "Cryin'Heart Blues", his sophomore album on Rural Rhythm Records. He continued to wow audiences with the energy of the early days of bluegrass to every show. "The song, "Cryin *Heart Blues*", went to #1 on the Bluegrass Unlimited Charts and the song "Matches" was one #1 on Sirius-XM Most Played Tracks.

Multi-Grammy® Award winner Carl Jackson writes in the liner notes of Audie's first self-titled debut album on Rural Rhythm Records. "This new project by Audie Blaylock and Redline is not only *bluegrass...* its GREAT bluegrass... no argument... end of discussion!!!

<u>Shannon & Heather</u> <u>Slaughter & County Clare</u>

Shannon was raised in the rural North Florida town of Chiefland. He was immersed in acoustic and country music at a young age by his family. Shannon started his professional career with the Lost and Found in 1992, moving to Virginia that summer. In December Shannon joined the Larry Stephenson Band and was an integral sideman for 3 years. After a couple of years off the road, he re-entered the bluegrass profession, touring with Melonie Cannon in 2004 and 2005. In the fall of 2005. he became guitarist and lead vocalist with The Lonesome River Band, touring and recording with the awardwinning band until 2007. Shannon and his wife Heather form the nucleus of County Clare.

Art Stevenson & Highwater

Art Stevenson & Highwater is Wisconsin's best-known bluegrass show, and has been in demand throughout the Midwest festival circuit since 1993. The band's bluegrass sound comes from the close duet singing of husband and wife team Art and Stephanie Stevenson, along with the spirited banjo and Dobro playing of Dale Reichert, and the harddriving mandolin picking of Bruce King. High Water's repertoire is taken from many sources: the bluegrass classics of Bill Monroe and the Stanley Brothers, early country music, mountain songs, and new material. Their blend of traditional bluegrass numbers, originals, contemporary songs, and instrumentals satisfies a wide range of music lovers.

This will prove to be an outstanding lineup and along with the bands from across the Maritimes and all our local groups we look forward to a weekend of fine bluegrass music.

We are in the process of hiring Maritime and Local bands and also reviewing ways in to improve our 2014 festival.

We had a total of eight children this year for the Children's Program, with seven being available to join us on stage. Hand-made, hand-painted instruments (mandolin, guitars, fiddles and banjos) were made by John Barlow. Each year, the children are allowed to choose which instrument they would like to "play" on stage and they get to take them home. This year we overheard a comment from one of the children. "Next

year, I'm choosing a fiddle then I'll have all of them." As usual, the children were a big hit with the audience. Thank you to all who were involved to make this program possible... Ellen Arsenault, Lorraine Barlow and Lindsay Jones, John Barlow, and also the two girls from Parks Canada.

Much appreciation to those who helped with so many aspects of the Festival: Angela MacCormac for doing Al MacRae's Field tasks, Bob Sharples who continues to support us with his field lining equipment, Gate Volunteers, Emery's Ways & Means people, the Dump station (Gerald & Fern Heustis) and others.
