We are extremely pleased to announce that our 34th annual festival will be held at The Dundas Fair Grounds in Dundas, PEI. Lots of perfectly level camping and a large indoor air conditioned space in case of bad weather.

Planning is already underway for better spacing of parking like handy cap requirements, quiet area, spacing of the lots, entrance location, band parking, and inclement weather requirements. And yes

folks, there is plenty of green space for a great weekend on these large grounds, it has been well maintained with many improvements over the years.

The fairgrounds were established during the Second World War in an effort to assist with the war effort and have continued since.
