Planning is already underway for our second year at Dundas Fair Grounds for parking to meet handy cap requirements, quiet area, and spacing of the lots, entrance location, band parking, and inclement weather requirements. And yes folks, there is plenty of green space for a great weekend on these large grounds, it has been well maintained with many improvements over the years.



Aaron and Hannah Stiff, members of the Stiff Family Band, are well known musicians across Canada who now reside on Prince Edward Island. This year, Aaron and Hannah volunteered to do the Children's Program and spent a couple of hours teaching the children songs for their (above pictured) stage performance. The little wooden instruments are made and painted by John Barlow. Each child gets to choose an instrument to play on stage and they are allowed to keep them.

The fairgrounds were established during the Second World War in an effort to assist with the war effort and have continued since. The approximate 100 acers' have been used each year for agriculture competitions and fairs, the competitors and audience come with many modes of camping gear for those weekends.

The Dundas Fair Grounds location is close to larger centers:

- 50 minutes to Charlottetown;
- 20 minutes to Montague;
- 20 minutes to Georgetown;
- 20 minutes to Souris; and only
- 40 minutes to Wood Islands Ferry.

We are looking forward to seeing all our music friends and making new friends at this wonderful location this summer.
